1991 was a good year for Loral Data Systems as revenues and profit were significantly up from last year. Backlog remains at a healthy 7 months worth of shipments. The bad news is that orders were down approximately 6% as we are feeling the effects of the recession and declining Department of Defense budget. We have reduced head count through attrition and release of temporary workers. We are training and moving employees to protect jobs to the maximum extent possible. Our products and capabilities remain state of the art but we are affected by external forces.

We are projecting that 1992 will be a good year but revenues and profit will be a little lower due to the shortfall of orders this year. Head count will continue to decrease through attrition. The extent of head count reduction depends entirely on our success in booking new business. We have hired additional marketing and sales people and are sparing no effort or expense to bring in new business. I am confident that we will turn the corner and return to growing the business.

Have a wonderful holiday season. Rest up and return to make 1992 another success.




LORAL FAMILY PICNIC 1991



1991 TELEMETERING CONFERENCE A GREAT SUCCESS FOR LDS

WE SET THE STAGE

The International Telemetering Conference (ITC), which took place in Las Vegas November 4-7, was an extremely important show for LDS. Countries represented included the U.S., England, Australia, Taiwan, Japan, Germany, the Netherlands, Spain and Italy. **Ken Slezak** and **Harry Durrett** escorted our foreign customers.

There were 123 show booths and 2200 paid attendees, the largest in the show's 27 year history. This volunteer organization has a 20 member Board of Directors. LDS members included **Wiley Dunn**, Eastern Executive Manager, and **Jim Horvath**, Chairman of Photography, for this year's show. LDS is proud and pleased that they were reelected for the 1992 show. So after the Holidays, ITC plans start anew.

Jim Horvath provided an outstanding booth design which, for the first time, used the Loral Corporate show properties housed in Copley, Ohio. These properties are modular building blocks that allow for great flexibility in booth design. Steve Frayer, Computer Aided Graphics, built a model of this booth for Jim. Loral had a prime location allowing for good hall visibility. As the show's largest booth (1500 sq feet), it allowed for good circulation and outstanding demonstrations.

WE PROMOTED SALES

Show time was from 9 A.M. to 6 P.M.. The Hospitality Suite was open from 6 P.M. until early morning with over 600 people attending each night. The feature attraction in the Hospitality Suite was the impressive 20 minute EMR System 90 video. The video, written and produced by **Scott Havens**, Tech Pubs, will be used as a valuable sales tool.

LDS gave away solar calculators, mouse pads and covers, and a grand prize of a Sony TV. From this list of prize winners, **Bud Hinkel** selected 338 names as prospective customers, FAXed their names and addresses to **Terry Cori** at the plant, who then had **JoAnn Tonkin's** Tech Pubs Services group assemble packets of brochures and sales information.

These packets were on the prospective customer's desk upon their return from the show. As a direct result of this mailing, Bud said we have already received calls that could result in new business opportunities for LDS.

WE INTRODUCED NEW PRODUCTS/SYSTEMS

O/S90, our new telemetry systems software product, was introduced. O/S90 allows us to build systems using multiple-vendor compilers and workstations. It features an open system architecture for real-time display and data acquisition. The highlight of the O/S90 demonstration was the unique open windows with live video. None of our competitors could do this.

The O/S90 ITC demo support team included Mike Meesit and Tony Carwile for Hardware, with Bob Feather and Dan Smith for Software. Dan Smith and Laura Merritt were instrumental in getting the system up and ready for the ITC. Bob, Dan and Laura put in many 15 hour days preparing for the show.

The O/S90 demonstrated at ITC was based on the Martin TPPS system. Walt Knopik is the Program Manager for this system, which will be delivered in February. Don Riker is the Technician. Jon Mather is the lead engineer for the Software Development Team and is supported by Ron Perrella, Dan Smith, Gwen Terrell, Doug Bass, Jeff Eastwood, Ron Kimraj, Teri Vokus, Jeff Kelley, Adam Leonard, Allen Nehme, Bharat Patel, Eduardo Carro, Larry Creel and Dan Cunningham.

Tim Gatton introduced the EMR Personal Computer eXport (PCX) Desktop Telemetry System. Sunil Rananavace, our India representative, provided the workstation demonstrations.

Jack Long, Bill Vernooy, Steve Hoff and Ray Shuford introduced and demonstrated the new Rotary Recorder. This working unit was produced jointly with Schlumberger. It records and reproduces at the rate of 240 mega bits of digital data per second and meets MIL-STD-2179 requirements.

WE PRESENTED PAPERS

Bob Feather and **Mike O'Brien** presented an O/S 90 paper to a packed, standing room only hall.

Bob is a lead software engineer in O/S90 development and Mike is an expert on the EMR 8715, a central product in O/S90 design. Their paper had an enthusiastic reception. Bill Anderson presented a paper on Internationalization of Telemetry Systems. His paper addressed the growth of foreign trade and the need for U.S companies to offer local language user interfaces on delivered systems.

Bharat Parkhani and **Paul Taylor** presented a paper on The Use of Telemetry Preprocessor in a Real-Time Closed Loop Test System. This paper addressed the application for testing the anti-aircraft Fire Control System of a telemetry preprocessor. The test set for verification would give the user a test platform that provides productivity improvement.

Gene Schroeder gave a paper on the EMR 9020 Adaptive Bit Synchronizer (ABS).

The Technical Publications group and the Graphic Arts group wrote, coordinated, designed and produced the 1992 Condensed Catalog, O/S90 and PCX brochures for the ITC show. Neil Plume and Mike Stapleton provided outstanding photography support in the catalog, brochures and System 90 video.
