



## Loral Data Systems Celebrates Second Successful Space Shuttle Flight for DV-6000 Series Recorders

The Loral Data systems DV-6000 series of high speed digital recorders has successfully returned from its second space shuttle flight with over 60 hours of storage images of earth gathered through the shuttle Endeavours' high-resolution Shuttle Imaging Radar-C and X-Band Synthetic Aperture Radad antenna. NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory, which managed the mission, has proclaimed the recorders' performance flawless, and indicated the quality of the data captured exceeded all expectations.

The images were transferred to the DV-6000 at 180 million bits per second (Mbits/s) and represent over 30 trillion bits of data recorded on 150 magnetic cassette tapes. Had the mission used more conventional 1.44 megabyte floppy disks, this amount of data would have required in excess of 4,500,000 disks. The recorders will next be operational on Endeavours' flight in August of this year. Below astronaut Rich Clifford installs a cassette in space.






# Congratulations, Graduates We Are Proud of You!

#### MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

TO: ALL LDS EMPLOYEES

Just a quick update as we approach mid fiscal year.

The future of Telecommunications (CPS 100) is looking up. We have been selected for lab trials by a large regional Bell company and a smaller independent telephone company. Our product is also being tested by Bellcore, the standards organization for telephone companies. The testing is going well and Bellcore is very impressed with the features of our product. We continue to develop additional functions and features because this is "living" product which will continuously evolve with ever faster processing speeds. We are gearing up for production and are confident that we have a real winner. As I mentioned in our recent all hands meeting, the relationship with our marketing partner, ADC Telecommunications Inc., is getting closer which tells me they believe we have a winner.


The remainder of LDS is holding it's own. SPS won a couple of good contracts and is growing. Aviation Recorders are holding market share but are having reliability difficulties. We have a solution which will be implemented very soon.

Instrumentation Recorders are slow at the moment but orders are beginning to come in for VLDS. We expect VLDS order this year will exceed 45 recorders. Rotary recorders have a big opportunity in the ATARS program which we hope to book this October. Medical is exceeding our wildest expectations. We will sell around 8 simulators this year which will double our forecast.

We are not out of the woods yet but are getting close. We expect our work force will remain stable but we are watching the orders very closely. I am confident that the future will be good because we have the best products and a dedicated, hard working, intelligent work force.
